In my 30 years with the Society, I've seen firsthand the impact that animals have on humans. Their love for us is unconditional, their loyalty unwavering. And

It's always been my goal – and the goal of RSPCA NSW – to make sure humans keep our promise of love, devotion and care to the animals. Animals, after all, show us astounding trust, no matter the circumstances.

I often think back to a few years ago, when I was still an inspector, and got a call about an underweight dog. I remember arriving at the property and looking over the fence to see what I thought was a black dog lying on the ground, unable to stand. I wasn't even sure she was alive. She had lost most of her hair and was so thin that her eyes appeared sunken into her head. With no one at the house, I picked her up and drove her the 40 minutes back to the shelter, stopping three times on the way just to check she was still breathing. Fortunately, she made it, and I passed her into the care of our

veterinary team. Some months later, I saw a young couple in the shelter adopting a beautiful black dog. When the dog saw me, she ran straight to me, almost bowling me over. I held her head in my hands and looked into her eyes, and in that moment I realised it was the dog that I had rescued all those months earlier. She was completely transformed.

Although months had passed, that beautiful young dog had remembered me and the kindness I'd shown her when I took her away from that life of pain and despair.

But it wasn't just me who picked her up that day. It was you too. You help give animals a reason to believe in something better. Even when they are knocked around and treated poorly, animals still, amazingly, have faith in humans. They give us so much love and trust that we owe them our protection.

Thank you for considering such an incredible gift to the animals. Thank you for making, and keeping, that promise of protection.

For nearly 150 years, RSPCA NSW and animal lovers like you have been putting animals first. Today, through your passionate involvement, we can dream of achieving this more than ever.





How to leave a gift in your Will to the animals



Step 1: Consider your loved ones and the causes that matter most

This is probably the most powerful gift you can ever make. Think about your family, friends and the charitable causes that have meant so much to you in your lifetime.



Step 2: Decide what your gift to RSPCA NSW will be

There are a number of ways you can remember RSPCA NSW in your Will.

Common types of gifts include:

- · Residual: the most effectual way to support the animals. After you have provided for your loved ones, the whole or a percentage of the remainder of your estate can be left to RSPCA NSW.
- Percentage: a percentage of your total estate, allowing your gift to maximise as vour estate matures.
- **Specific:** a fixed sum of money or assets, including property, investments or shares.



Step 3: Make or update your Will

Your Will is an important document that must be properly prepared and executed. We recommend that you seek

independent professional advice to make sure your Will is legal, valid and represents your intentions. If you are kind enough to be including a gift to RSPCA NSW in your Will, make sure you use the correct wording, as suggested on the following page.



Step 4: Notify your loved ones and RSPCA NSW

Clear communication is critical to ensuring your final wishes are carried

out and means there are 'no surprises' when the time comes. Let your family, any executors, and quardians know that a gift to RSPCA NSW is important to you. If you are comfortable, please inform us as well. It is increasingly common in NSW for Wills to be contested, so any intentions shared during your lifetime help support your choices, should they ever be questioned after your passing.

Suggested wording for your solicitor

We suggest the following wording be used in the drafting of your Will:

- and bequeath to the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals New South Wales, of 201 Rookwood Road. Yaqoona, NSW, 2199 (ABN 87 000 001 641) for the use and purposes of the said Society:
- a) the residue (or % of the residue) of my estate
- b) % of my estate
- c) a sum of \$ free of all death and estate duties.

I direct that the receipt of the Treasurer or a Proper Officer of the Society authorised to act on his/her behalf shall be sufficient discharge to my executors.







Who will care for your pets if you no longer can?

In the majority of Australian states, animals are legally deemed property. Therefore, in the event of your passing, your pets would be transferred to the beneficiaries of your estate. If you're not sure those beneficiaries would be suitable or able to look after your pets, RSPCA NSW is able to offer an alternative.

We always recommend that family or friends who know your animals, and who are able to take on your pets, are the best option. However, if this is not an option, the RSPCA NSW Home Ever After program is a safe and trusted plan B.

As any pet owner knows, a loving home is the best possible outcome for an animal. When you enrol your pets onto the program, we work with you to create a unique pet profile that can be used to find them a home that perfectly suits them. This is just one of a range of benefits the Home Ever After program offers, with the most important being reassurance that you've done the right thing by your pet. It's the ultimate peace of mind.
